- 4. SLFRF Compliance Report, which is required under ARPA Grant was filed on behalf of the Town by Baldwins (BBS services). This completes our reporting responsibilities and ARPA funding.
- 5. A thank you letter to the Town from the Livingston Co. Office of the aging for the use of the Springwater town hall for exercise classes.

- 6. A letter was received from NYS DOT informing us of our unsuccessful grant application for the Canadice Rd culvert over Limekiln creek. Project exceeding funding. The NYS DOT encouraged the Town of Springwater to reapply for next year's funding rounds.
- 7. A Letter was received from the Association of Towns that they are increasing annual dues from \$999 to \$1,098 for 2025.

- 2. Request from Donald Haywood for "Decommissioning of the Water and Sewer services" for his property at 8107 South Main Street property. Mr. Haywood was advised that the debt tax will remain on this parcel.

- 3. **INFORMATION** Attorney Jim Campbell is pursuing the violations from the Code Enforcement office for the properties on East Avenue through the court system.
- 4. Start to pursue new camera system at the park behind the American Legion on School Street due to safety concerns and ongoing property damages.
