STATE OF EMERGENCY DECLARATION

A State of Emergency is hereby declared in the Town of Springwater in Livingston County, effective at 8:00 AM on March 16, 2020.

This local State of Emergency has been declared due to the public health impacts of the Coronavirus-19 (COVID-19), which the World Health Organization has designated as a world-wide pandemic. While the Town and County lacks positive cases at the present moment, this pandemic represents a clear and imminent threat to public health, welfare and safety in our town and within Livingston County. The Town is taking this proactive measure to assure continuity of operations, promote communication relative to this crisis and to prepare adequately for the necessary public service response.

As the Chief Executive of Springwater, I, Deborah Babbitt Henry, Town Supervisor, exercise the authority given me under Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law, to preserve the public health and public safety and hereby render all required and available assistance vital to the security, well-being, and health and safety of the citizens of the Town of Springwater.

This State of Emergency does not in any way impact travel at this time. Town government operations will continue unless otherwise advised.

I hereby direct all departments and agencies of the Town of Springwater to take whatever steps necessary to protect life, health, property, public infrastructure and provide such emergency assistance deemed necessary.

This State of Emergency will remain in effect for thirty days or until rescinded or renewed by a subsequent order.
